# Stan Strout Commemoration

In September PCAM lost a warm and wonderful man - and a real WW II hero. His type of heroism was of the quiet kind, and it took me over 10 years to piece together those things that made him a hero while in the military - as well as a strong, dedicated, and unselfish contributor to two air museums, after the military.

Stan was one of a unique group of men who, in February of 1941, joined the United States Army Air Corps before we were actually in a shooting war. After basic training he was shipped to Australia where he helped load crated P-40's onto our first aircraft carrier, CV-1, the *Langley*. The ship was ordered to deliver these aircraft to Java and Stan was slated to accompany that shipment. His orders, fortunately, were changed at the last minute to go to India because the *Langley* was subsequently sunk by Japanese air and naval forces. After assembling many of the P-40's in India (some of which went to Chennault's AVG group, the Flying Tigers), his squadron was transferred to a small village in China near Chungking where he spent the rest of WW II as a P-40 and P-51 Crew Chief in the area called the CBI (China-Burma-India Theater), also called "The Forgotten War."

His squadron was supposed to get rations of U.S military food flown in regularly, but the Chinese somehow "misinterpreted" the orders and appropriated the rations which found their way into their own stores. Consequently, from 1943 through 1945 Stan and his squadron mates were fed nothing but Chinese peasant food cooked in fish oil and they became so emaciated and undernourished that when they got an annual two week furlough, they spent it in a Medical Rehab Hospital in Australia. It was necessary to rebuild their bodies and energies!! This was their only "R & R"!

Stan was a Charter and Founding Member of the Redwood Empire Aviation Historical Society (REAHS) along with another member of that group who has left us, Harrison Rued. REAHS existed as an active museum from 1988 until we merged with PCAM in 1999. Our activities around building both of the Dioramas now in our PCAM museum were accompanied by establishing a separate aviation history museum in Healdsburg, and a great deal of PR in the county with presentations to various groups.

Stan was the power source for many of our programs, and he was able to design, build, and properly maintain an endless group of construction model projects. He overcame problems calmly and thoroughly, and his favorite saying when we began to get edgy over a problem was "let's spec it out".

As a PCAM volunteer, he taped our monthly meeting speakers for over three years, worked in the history group regularly, and provided many historical artifacts from his own collection which we now house in our museum.

During his final days he talked constantly of our museum, aviation history, how wonderful it was to work with Ray Anderson in historical research. The last time I saw him he was very "up" and had a big, warm smile on his face.

# Air Museum Leader Honored by Sonoma County

#### **100 STUDENTS HAVE FIELD TRIP AT PCAM**

The Pacific Coast Air Museum, in partnership with the Wells Fargo Center for the Airs,, hosted 100 5th & 6th grade students from Old Adobe & St. Eugene's schools on a 2 hour field trip to PCAM. Five educational stations were open for the students including the Albatross, the IL-14 and the Huey Helicopter. About 10 PCAM docents were on hand to welcome the students, teachers and parents aboard the aircraft. The students had five 20 minute classes or 20 minutes at each station to learn about the mission and basics of each air plane. This event began with Allan Morgan making a one hour presentation to each of the four classes about aviation History and "First Black Combat Pilot", Eugene Bullard. The students attended a play at the Wells Fargo Center for the Arts about Eugene, then came to the museum for the field trip. A follow up visit to the class rooms will was made November 24 and 25 to recap the stage play, the field trip and expand the students understanding of aviation safety and the affect air travel has had on every day life.













#### Pacific Coast Air Museum & The Town of Windsor; A Partnership

In March, 2008, Town of Windsor Assistant Town Manager, Christa Johnson and Community Services Director Donna Legge met with the Pacific Coast Air Museum Executive Director Dave Pinsky and Marketing Director Roger Olson to discuss a partnership to mutually benefit the town of Windsor and the Annual PCAM Air Show.

The Pacific Coast Air Museum provided a banner advertising the "Wings Over Wine Country Air Show" for the Windsor's Town Green weekly Summer series concert and movie events. PCAM also had an article in the Town's Summer Recreation guide promoting the event.

Mayor Fudge presented PCAM President Mike Voorhees and PCAM Executive Director Dave Pinsky and Roger Olson, the Marketing Director with a Proclamation on August 6, 2008, declaring the third week in August 2008 Pacific Coast Air Museum "Wings Over Wine Country Air Show" week.

The town of Windsor was listed as a sponsor of the Air Show on the banner and in the PCAM Air Show Program as well. 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#### **ELECTION ALERT ......**

This year's nomination committee for the up and coming election for the Pacific Coast Air Museum's Board of Directors was tasked with the job of recruiting and qualifying candidates to run for the board.

Our museum is entering into a new and exciting stage of growth. Because of this dynamic change, the board of directors and the museum's administration are also undergoing a time and need for change. The museum has become a very successful "non- profit" organization and has reached a point of being a true business with all of the management and decision making needs and goals of a "for-profit" company. Because the board of directors will be very important in the process of defining and steering the museum towards these goals, the nomination committee chose to "think out of the box" or in this case, think not only in but also outside of our general membership.

The fields of experience that were targeted were legal and professional, business management and financial planning and control. Non-profit board of director experience was also a recommending factor in qualifying candidates.

The nomination committee is pleased to report that this year's election has six (6) candidates running for three (3) seats on the board of directors. Three (3) of the candidates are incumbents running for re-election and three (3) are new members. All are qualified as candidates for election to the board of directors.

Very shortly, you will receive an election ballot along with your membership renewal. Please fill it out and return by mail or bring it to the "Christmas Party" and general membership meeting on December 17<sup>th</sup>. Your vote is important!

#### Last Chance to Make Tax Free IRA Rollover Donation

If you are age 70 1/2 or older and own an IRA or other type of qualified retirement plan, you may make a tax-free rollover gift to the Pacific Coast Air Museum if you do so by December 31, 2008. Most withdrawals are taxed, however Congress has extended a 2007 provision to allow this time-limited opportunity to make a tax free rollover to charities such as the Pacific Coast Air Museum.

- I. This must be directly donated to the Pacific Coast Air Museum (or other qualifying non-profit) from a traditional or ROTH IRA. If you have a different type of plan, you must first make a tax free transfer to the IRA before donating to us.
- 2. You cannot personally withdraw the gift. It must be transferred directly to the Pacific Coast Air Museum or have your plan administrator make the check out to the museum.
- 3. Your gift will count toward your minimum annual distribution.
- 4. This must be completed by December 31, 2008, so time is of the essence.
- 5. Maximum contribution from all IRA'S is \$ 100,000.
