Battleship Expo at the Port of Richmond USS IOWA BB 61 Pacific Battleship Center

Goal – Limited open house on the USS IOWA to the general public through the end of March (change from end of January). Exterior work on the Iowa only takes place on the weekdays (pressure blasting and repainting). Visitors are allowed on the bow-section of the ship. A donation of \$10 for adults 18 and over, \$5 for children 12 to 17, and 11 and under free.

Parking provided on Terminal 3's wharf with a restriped parking lot. An eating area will be created with tables and chairs, with food trucks present. Porte-potties will also be provided. Fire extinguishers, first aid kits and an AED kit will be on site.

A "mini" military museum will be located in the adjoining warehouse, using 12,700 square feet of space. Planned displays include armored vehicles, ship models, vintage cars, battleship projectiles, large banners with cut away illustrations of the lowa's interior and her history, and missile displays. IOWA merchandise and PBC "Plankowner" memberships will be on sale to the public. Other local museum groups may place their information on display as well.

The Pacific Coast Air Museum is displaying the Blue Angels F-4 Cockpit every weekend for the entire open house and staffing it with volunteers who are passing out information about our museum.

With the extension of the exhibit to the end of March, we sure could use more volunteers to staff our exhibit and represent the Pacific Coast Air Museum to staff our Blue Angels cockpit and tell folks about our museum and Air Show. All who have volunteered so far report meeting a lot of very nice people, most of who had never heard of the Pacific Coast Air Museum before. STRAIGHT SCOOP

LOG YOUR VOLUNTEER HOURS

It is important for all of us to log our volunteer hours because they show the level of support the museum receives from its own members. Why is that so? When it is time for the museum to apply for grants or request donations from donors of substantial means they in many cases want to know the level of support from the members and they measure that by hours volunteered. Some of these groups, especially foundations, have formulas (or rules of thumb) to convert hours to a dollar figure. That figure is \$25.00 per hour.

Well, folks, so far this year, 2011, there are 10,197.4 hours logged, for a total of \$254,935, the value of the hours you have donated.

Now you can see the importance of hours logged and we know many of you have been remiss in not staying current. This is especially true for the Air Show. It is easy to log your hours. A hard copy logbook can be found in the museum crew lounge and the new shop for you working on your airplanes.

A **Volunteer Badge** is available to anyone who donates any of his or her time.

Volunteer Hour Pins are awarded for 100, 300, 500 and increments of 1000 hours to 5000 hours.

Our Guest Speaker at the January 18th, 2012, membership meeting will be Fire Captain Chris Jurasek of the CAL Fire. Chris commands the Sonoma Air Attack Base here at the Charles M. Schulz- Sonoma County Airport. He has served with CAL Fire air programs for almost nine years and he has eighteen years all together working with CAL Fire. He has also flown in helicopters with the California National Guard.

Chris is the Air Tactical Group Supervisor operating aboard the OV-10 Bronco coordinating the aerial response at fires throughout the state. His role is much like a Forward Air Controller (FAC) operating with the Air Force, Navy or Marine Corps aviation units. Chris says while other Fire Captains operate on the ground, his fire truck has wings and flies. Many at this year's Wings of Wine Country Air Show saw him and his aircraft scrabble in response to a real-time call out.
