PCAM's AED Is Back In Service

On Saturday, 16 June, Ted Williams gave a CPR and AED Certification Class to 14 of PCAM's volunteers. Also involved were 5 manikins, but they didn't seem to mind.

The AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is most effective in conjunction with CPR (Cardio Pulmonary

Resuscitation), so we spent the first hour going over the basics of CPR. Every few years, the protocols change a bit and new guidelines are incorporated into the procedure, so recurrent and refresher training is needed. The AED operation is amazingly simple and effective. Statistics quoted were that basic CPR is effective only about 6-7% of the time, but with the AED, the positive outcome is more like 60-70%. That's huge!

Dan Widger, our Safety Officer, has taken charge of the AED, along with first aid kits and fire extinguishers. The AED will be located in the PCAM break room near the fire extinguisher and wall-mounted first aid

kit. During special events, it will be kept at the announcer's booth...along with the first aid kit.

The AED had been sent out for service several months ago, and PCAM President Dave Ford located it at Medtronic's service department, waiting for directions on what to do with it. Basically, it just needed a new battery, a routine check, and some new pads (they have a limited shelf life, as does the battery).

Thank You Ted for a most informative training session, including numerous questions about "what if"....

Even more exciting is to fly a 'Cat launch' of the Hornet from the deck of the USS Stennis, then test yourself to fly an arrested landing back aboard the carrier. The realism is fantastic.

Petaluma Aviation Clubs Come to PCAM

On Saturday June 9th, two Aviation Clubs from Petaluma made their school year-end pilgrimage to the Pacific Coast Air Museum (PCAM). Students got a tour of the museum, learned some of the history about the Santa Rosa Army Air Corps Field, and got to sit in the cockpits of some of the museum's aircraft. Six students from Old Adobe School District's La Tercera Elementary School - STEM (Eagles) making their first trip were enthusiastically accompanied by Principal Michelle Hughes and Teacher/Club sponsor Dan Landa. Ten students from Petaluma School District's McKinley School (Mustangs) were celebrating their school's sixth year of Aviation Club. Principal Mathew Harris and Teacher/Club sponsor Kristin Parnow continue to steadfastly support the program. Each school's carpool included many parents, grandparents, as well as younger brothers and sisters. Students and family would learn some invaluable aviation lessons on this day of flying. More on that latter.

Both Aviation Clubs, were organized through a collaborative partnership between the Petaluma Rotary Club and PCAM. Each club meets weekly for an hour long, after-school session. Utilizing Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) while teaching about numerous aspects of aviation, this year's instructors included Ed Fullerton, Michael Nessler and Clark Rosen from Petaluma Rotary; and Joshua McKeighan from the Petaluma





Municipal Airport, recently a U.S. Marine Corps Weapons Systems Officer flying in the F/A-18 Hornet. Charley Taylor represents PCAM.



Course work included aviation history, the elements of flight, learning the different types of aircraft, aviation physiology, physics of flight, meteorology and utilization of graphs and charts to learn about the effects of pressure and temperature on flight performance. Meetings also covered clips from great flying movies, careers in aviation, survival and safety, elements of leadership and personal communication and the very popular paper airplane construction and flight testing.

A very special thanks to go out to dedicated PACM Docents Duane Coppock (HU-16E Albatross), Dan Widger (T-37 Tweet), Anthony Sarganis (F-4C Phantom), Pam Summers (UH-1E Huey) and Jim Mattison (Docent Coordinator); Gift Shop volunteer Alan Chensvold; and finally, PCAM volunteer pilots/owners, Paul Heck, Kevin Quirk, John Roberts and Art Hayssen.

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On the morning of the scheduled flights, excessive winds had already lead the organizers of the Windsor Balloon Festival to cancel their flight operations. When pilot Paul Heck arrived at PCAM, he reported winds at the airport were 15 knots with gusts to 23 knots and 30 degrees off runway heading. The forecast called for higher gusts throughout the day. Those winds would all but guarantee bumpy rides for our neophyte aviators, as well as challenging cross wind conditions upon return to Charles M Schulz - Sonoma County Airport. The decision was made

to forgo the days flights and reschedule them for early in the next school year.

Paul Heck graciously offered to pull his 1944 US Army Jeep out of his hanger and provide rides around the historic parts of the Army Air Field. That olive green Willys had actually been assigned the airfield in 1944 and has remained in Paul's family since just after the end of WWII. He alerted

passengers and observers by sounding the Jeep's Military Police siren with each departure and arrival. Paul also shared the fact that his family's Jeep had appeared in the TV series *Combat* in the early 1960s.

Open Cockpit: Korean War Weekend July 21st & July 22nd

Look inside these historic aircraft of the Korean War era!

On July 21 and 22, look inside four of the aircraft that fought the Korean War. The A-16C Invader was an attack aircraft first used in World War II and then used extensively in the Korean conflict. The RF-86F Sabre Jet was the photo reconnaissance version of this superlative first-generation jet fighter. The F-84F Thunderstreak was a swept-wing fighter bomber. And the F-86H Sabre Jet was a more powerful version of the F-86, not actually used during the Korean War but developed at that time to combat the increasingly powerful Eastern-bloc fighters equipping our North Korean opponent.

The RF-86F, F-84F, and F-86H are on loan from the National Naval Aviation Museum at Pensacola, Florida.



Open Cockpit weekends at the Pacific Coast Air Museum are your chance to get up close to selected aircraft and look inside. We raise the canopies and open the doors to give you an unobstructed view so you can see what a genuine fighter plane, attack plane, transport, helicopter, or other type is like from the inside!
