Executive Director's Update

Congratulations to everyone involved for a fantastic 2006 "Wings over Wine Country" Air Show. Saturday's attendance was the largest one day crowd we've ever had. We're still counting numbers and revenues, but by every measure, we had the biggest crowd and largest gross revenue of any Air Show in our history.

There were a lot of Air Show highlights — the C-17 static and demo flights, U-2 and T-38 flybys, F-18, A-10 and T-6 demos, Eddie Andreini's Super Stearman and Wing walker, Craig Teft in his Pitts. Kent Pietsch's Interstate Cub comedy act was hilarious. He had some people believing it was for real. On Sunday when Kent hooked up with the new Sonoma County fire truck, it looked even more real and was even funnier. One act that wowed the crowd was Bill Stein and his amazing aerobatics in the Edge540. I heard a lot of pilots saying "how does he make the airplane do that?" Having Wayne Handley narrate Bill's performance on Sunday really helped explain "how he makes the airplane do that".

The war birds flyby and the Dan Vance tribute to his father, Art Vance, were stirring and touching to all watching.

The C-17 crew said they were treated better here than at any Air Show they have ever attended, including Oshkosh last month. They called me Tuesday and asked if they could come back next year. I said "well, maybe" (just kidding).

A funny story...the C-17 narrator wondered how slow the C-17 really goes during its slow flight pass. So we got a Santa Rosa motorcycle officer to bring out the radar gun. When he practiced on an Eddie Andreini's Stearman pass and the radar gun read "160 mph", the officer turned to me and said "that's the highest reading l've ever seen on the radar gun". Later he clocked the huge C-17 at an amazing 83mph at air show center during the slow flight pass. After the show another Santa Rosa police officer came up to the C-17 crew, sirens and lights flashing, and told him he was citing him for doing 83 mph in a 35 mph zone (pictures elsewhere in the newsletter). It was a hilarious moment to behold.

There are so many people to thank for the success of this year's Air Show that to try and name them all would be impossible. Every single one of you who contributed to the Air Show deserve our sincere congratulations and thanks. So please note the September 23rd "Survivor's BBQ" described on the front page of this newsletter and try to attend.

I'm going to take a chance and mention two people who performed some amazing feats in preparing for this year's show — to Mark Fajardin for his hundreds of hours of work in restoring our beautiful AV-8C Harrier to like new condition, and to Jim Cook for more than many of you know—thanks Mark and Jim.

There is a rumor that this was our last Air Show due to Horizon Air coming in. **NOT TRUE!!** The Airport Manager and I have already discussed how to have a great Air Show with Horizon here, and **we will have an Air Show on the third weekend of August, 2007!**

As you will read elsewhere, Jim Cook, Duane Coppock and I are heading up "Clean Up Our Museum Month" in September. Dates and what we are trying to do are all in the article. We can use all the help we can get on the work party dates listed.

The new aircraft layout at the museum is receiving rave reviews. I think it is beautiful and really adds to the "look " of the museum. Note the two corner aircraft at the intersection of Laughlin and Becker—what an entry statement.
