NORAD Tracks Santa

On Dec. 24, 1955, a call was made to the Continental Air Defense Command (CONAD) Operations Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. However, this call was not from the President or a General. It was from a girl in Colorado Springs who was following the directions in an advertisement printed in the local paper – she wanted to know the whereabouts of Santa Claus.

The ad said "Hey, Kiddies! Call me direct and be sure and dial the correct number." However, the number was printed incorrectly in the advertisement and rang into the CONAD operations center.

On duty that night was Colonel Harry Shoup, who has come to be known as the "Santa Colonel."

Colonel Shoup received numerous calls that night and rather than hanging up, he had his operators find the location of Santa Claus and reported it to every child who phoned in that night.

Thus began a tradition carried on by the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD) when it was formed in 1958. Today, through satellite systems, high-powered radars and jet fighters, NORAD tracks Santa Claus as he makes his Yuletide journey around the world.

Every Christmas Eve, thousands of volunteers staff telephones and computers to answer calls and e-mails from children (and adults) from around the world. Live updates are provided through the NORAD Tracks Santa Web site (in seven languages), over telephone lines, and by e-mail to keep curious children and their families informed about Santa's whereabouts and if it's time to get to bed.

Each year, the NORAD Tracks Santa Web Site receives nearly nine million unique visitors from more than 200 countries and territories around the world. Volunteers receive more than 12,000 e-mails and more than 70,000 calls to the NORAD Tracks Santa hotline from children around the globe.

This year, children and the young-at-heart are able to track Santa through Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Flickr, and TroopTube.tv. To follow us on any of these Web sites, type in @noradsanta into the search engine and start tracking.

NORAD Tracks Santa has become a magical and global phenomenon, delighting generations of families everywhere.

Santa's Reindeer

The most well-known names for the reindeer pulling Santa Claus' sleigh come from two sources. The names are: Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donner, Blitzen, & Rudolf

All but the last name come from the poem: 'Twas the Night before Christmas, commonly credited to Clement Clarke Moore (1779-1863). It was actually written in 1807 by Major Henry Livingston, Jr. (1748-1828) with the title Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas. The names "Donner" and "Blitzen" were changed by Moore from "Dunder" and "Blixem."

The last name, Rudolph, comes from a story and coloring book *Rudolf the Red-nosed Reindeer* that Robert L. May created in 1939 for his employer, the Montgomery Ward department store. The copyright for the story was later turned over to May, and his brother-in-law, Johnny Marks, wrote the well-known song that further popularized the character.

Two of the reindeer names, Donner/Donder and Blitzen, are often the source of confusion, misspelling, and misinformation. The short facts are these: Donner/Donder and Blitzen were named "Dunder" and "Blixem" (the Dutch words for "thunder" and "lightning") in the original printing of "A Visit From St. Nicholas." In reprints of the poem, the names became "Donder" and "Blixen," then "Donder" and "Blitzen" (the latter being German for "lightning"). By the time Johnny Marks wrote "Rudolph," it was "Donner" and "Blitzen" (possibly because "Donder" was musically awkward). See Snopes.com for a thorough discussion.

Elections

Each year the terms of three of the nine members of the Board of Directors expire and three Directors are elected to serve three year terms. The terms of Directors Barrett, Heck and Voorhees will expire December 31, 2011. Directors Heck and Voorhees are "termed out" and may not seek re-election. Director Barrett is eligible to seek re-election. Two of the Directors will be elected by the membership and one will be elected by the Board of Directors. The election process began with nominations made before or during the November monthly member meeting. The process concludes with the submission of written ballots prior to or during the December annual member meeting. General members who have been nominated and who meet the qualifications prescribed by our By Laws and who are eligible for this year's election are Glenn Barrett, Barbara Beedon and Tom Chauncy. All candidates were offered the opportunity to submit a written statement. The statements of those who submitted statements by the established deadline are printed on page two of the mailer. Please vote for no more than two (2) candidates. Ballots marked with votes for more than two candidates will not be counted. Please enclose your ballot in an envelope and mark it "Ballot Enclosed" on the front and mail it to the Pacific Coast Air Museum, 2230 Becker Boulevard, Santa Rosa, CA 95403. You may use the enclosed membership renewal envelope and send your ballot and membership renewal form and check in the same time (this is what we recommend).

Your ballot must reach the Pacific Coast Air Museum by December 21, 2011. As an alternative, you can hand deliver the ballot at the Annual Member Meeting on December 21, 2011, in the Conference Room at Mesa Beverage, 3200 N. Laughlin Road. All ballots must be handed in by that night at 7:30pm.

Membership Renewals

If your mailer contains a Membership Application, it means that our records show that your membership expires on December 31, 2011 (if the application has a sticker, your membership does not expire this year). Please renew now to continue your membership, support your museum and to avoid a lapse in your membership. If you have an AOA badge sponsored by the museum, you must be a current member of the museum or the museum can no longer sponsor you for an AOA badge. If you are a WWII veteran you do not have to pay dues, but we ask that you fill out and return the renewal form so we can keep your information up to date in our files.
