PCAM Education Team - Outlook Bright for 2019

As PCAM completes 2018, the Education Team looks forward to expanding the museum's role in education. We are on track to offer a week-long aviation program at *Excel for Kids* at Sonoma State University in early June, 2019. Classes will utilize STEM concepts to teach enrolled students about the principles of flight, aerodynamics, aviation physiology, aircraft design and construction along with building and flying drones. Highlights will also include a trip to PCAM to see and hear first-hand from docents about what flying our collection military aircraft is all about.

On Friday, February 15th, PCAM will join the Sonoma-Marin County Fair Grounds Director to commemorate the Wiseman-Cooke anniversary of the world's first airmail flight which took place from Petaluma to Santa Rosa in February, 1911. Those airmail letters and a copy of the Press Democrat took three days to complete that historic flight. Students will use STEM in the design, construction and flight testing various models of paper airplanes after learning about the elements that make flight possible.

In April, our Education Program will also inaugurate the first *Teachers Open House Saturday* that will be scheduled on each **Open Cockpit** weekend through October. Educators will be invited to tour the museum and learn how they can incorporate PCAM assets into their STEM and history curriculum. The goal is to increase opportunities for in classroom sessions including *Principles of Flight* and *Aviation History*. In addition teachers will be able to schedule PCAM visits for their student group visits to the view PCAM's historical aircraft with tours presented by our dedicated docents.

PCAM's 2019 Merit Badge Class schedule on Saturdays include: January 26st; May 11th; and October 14th. Education Instructor Emeritus Art Hayssen has earned the reputation for presenting and coordinating the exciting day-long course completing all the requirements to earn the Aviation Merit Badge. Scouts regularly come from every part of California.

Classroom sessions include discovering and identifying the varied types of "flying machines" and power plants, practical use of aircraft charts to compute aircraft performance such as takeoff and landing distances, as well as insights into the many opportunities in aviation careers and education. Popular highpoints include a tour of a working FAA Control Tower, and climbing into the cockpit of one of several historical military aircraft crewed by PCAM's men and women volunteers who flew and maintained PCAM's collection of planes. The ultimate highlights include instructed Virtual Reality (VR) flights in PCAM's simulator which is housed in the cockpit on an actual jet aircraft; and finally, flights above Sonoma County with some of our PCAM member pilots in their own aircraft.



In June, Sonoma Jet Center and PCAM join forces to again host 30 attendees of the Mike Hauser Academy. The Academy is organized by the Santa Rosa Metro Chamber which convenes recent Eighth Grader students headed for several local High Schools. The Chamber coordinates businesses, non-profit organizations, and teachers to empower our future workforce to become leaders in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The first day of each two day session involves tours and presentations by Sonoma Jet Center's owner and staff explaining their jobs and experiences in aviation. On day two, PCAM includes classroom presentations on aspects of aviation principles, using graphs and charts to calculate weight and balance and other items critical to safe flight; career and educational opportunities in aviation, hands-on aircraft construction techniques; meeting pilots, and learning about their early aviation experiences. Finally tours of PCAM's historic aircraft, with knowledgeable docents, and opportunities to fly in the exciting VR simulator completes day two.

PCAM's Aviation Explorer Post 707 continues their affiliation with the Flight Wing. Explorers have been provided excellent opportunities to gain hands-on experience learning by working on actual aircraft restoration projects while being mentored by Flight Wing members with lifetime experiences building, repairing, servicing and flying aircraft. Post 707 members will also have new opportunities to learn aviation history from PCAM members who have lived through many of those historical events.

From the Flight Wing

Season's Greetings to All:

I wasn't going to let the year close out without a brief review, saying thank you to all of you and a glimpse into next year. It seems that yet another year has raced by and with it many great experiences and even some lost opportunities. All of these are worthy of consideration as we contemplate our course for next year.

Between a late start, smoke and goofy weather we did manage to get some flying in. Most of that was in the C-IA which managed an appearance at our WOWC Air Show. Thanks to her able crew who rose to the occasion and and kept the aircraft healthy throughout the year. We didn't log much flight time with the rest of the fleet thanks to a variety of setbacks. But we are well prepared for 2019 and expect to do better. There are opportunities for pilots and anyone who would like to become involved in supporting these aircraft.

Our Windsor High STEM students are back again this year with a healthy crop of eager young participants. If they all show up on the same night our head count is now up to ten. Thanks to Paul Doto and Tony Bassignani for showing up each week to help manage the herd. As the number of participants continues to grow we are constantly looking for other individuals who can help out in the teaching arena to keep these young minds sufficiently challenged. They are anxious to be inspired and educated which is right up our alley.

Our summertime monthly Flight Wing meetings were successful considering the faithful members who attended them regularly. On several occasions we combined movie night with the Flight Wing dinner which seemed popular. With the help of Julie (Duchess) Barnes who frequently loaned us her significant culinary skills our monthly menu was the main attraction. The food combined with Dana Hunt's always entertaining video clips kept everyone suitably entertained and educated. We will do a better job next year of announcing upcoming meetings.

I am working on a proposal to the Flight Wing regarding the restoration of our Rearwin Sportster. With only eight total on the FAA register and only one of those currently flyable, information is slow in coming. There is a reliability issue regarding the radial engines normally found on these aircraft stemming from a shortage of engine parts and a steadily shrinking installed base of knowledge regarding their care and feeding. If our intent remains to restore this aircraft to flyable condition, then I am proposing to sell our current collection of original engine parts to help fund the purchase of a newly manufactured Rotec R2800 engine. They are comparable in size, weight and horsepower. The Rotec engine would provide us with many hours of reliable operation. The manufacturer will provide assistance in the design and manufacture of a mount. Our challenge will be the successful integration of this engine into the air frame, a challenge that we are well equipped to address.

Lastly, thanks to each and every one of you for supporting the Flight Wing. Ours is an honorable and worthy passion and we have an admirable track record. Our future looks bright and with your support and participation next year will be even greater. \bigcirc

Jungle Fighter Pilots A Recap of PCAM's November Presentation by David Rogers, Capt. USAF Ret

A special thank you to Capt. Rogers for sharing his account of what life was like in a combat zone as a Forward Air Controller (FAC) flying the Cessna O-I supporting the Korean Tiger Division, Viet Nam. Capt. Rogers also shared a pictorial representation of the Vietnamese people, how they lived and gave us a special look at the Viet Cong, up front and personal.

Capt. David Rogers Biography:



David Rogers was born in Tillamook Oregon in 1939 and graduated with a BS in General Engineering, University of Portland, 1962. He then worked on the Boeing Minuteman Missile 47 R&D section, 1962-1963. Upon graduation from Pilot Training in Class 64D, Williams AFB Chandler AZ, he flew the B -52H from the Grand Forks AFB North Dakota, 1964-1969. During the Vietnam War, David was Air Liaison Officer with a staff of 4 pilots and 4 enlisted personnel assigned to the Kore-

an 1st Regiment, Tiger Division, Viet Nam, 1969-1970. Returning Stateside, David graduated with a BS in Mechanical Engineering, Oregon State University, 1973. After becoming a Registered Mechanical Engineer, David in 1976 started Rogers & Associates, an Engineering Consulting Firm specializing in Hydronic and Thermodynamic systems optimization. This firm was sold to his partners in 2006. David then assisted Seattle-based Flow Control Industries in developing an energy company, Flow Energy, from 2006-2011. He is now retired.


